The LAUSD receives over **80 percent** of its General Fund Restricted and Unrestricted money from Base Revenue Limit and other State sources. LAUSD's General Fund pays for school expenses including:

SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION

The LAUSD is undergoing a \$19.5 billion voter-approved transformation to build new schools to reduce overcrowding and improve existing campuses throughout the District. Since the first bond was passed in 1997:

New K-12 schools constructed 111 K-12 new schools remaining to be built 20

More than 25,000 modernization and repair projects have been completed at existing campuses.
